## MISSION STATEMENT:

Cowlitz County CASA is a powerful voice, advocating for the best interest of abused and neglected children in the dependency court system in our community.

## COMMUNITY IMPACT:

When a child is a victim of neglect or abuse, the state court dependency system steps in, not only to keep the child safe today, but also to ensure a safe, stable, and nurturing home for the child. Currently there are over 260 children in Cowlitz County participating in dependency court, and the average case lasts 36 months. Three years is a long time for anyone, especially a child and it is easy for the best interests of a child to get lost in the shuffle. Our staff and volunteers work tirelessly to ensure the best outcomes possible for these children. CASA volunteers review cases to make sure their children are getting the medical, dental, educational, emotional, and physical needs met in the most stable situation possible as they move through this journey. We also support the child in feeling like a 'normal' kid by helping them participate in extracurricular activities and when possible, helping with clothing, toys, and other items they may need as they change placement.

## MISSION STATEMENT:

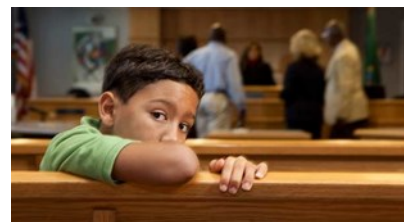

This can make the difference in establishing strong relationships with children, making adjustments and increases in income, and removing the complex barriers that exist in simply understanding what to do to move a legal case forward on your own. The definition of homelessness under the Act includes children or youth that live in shelters or transitional housing, parks, vehicles, abandoned public buildings, doubled up with other families due to loss of housing or economic hardship, couch surfing, living in motels or hotels, camp grounds due to lack of alternative accommodations or are Unaccompanied Youth not in the physical custody of their parents or legal guardian.

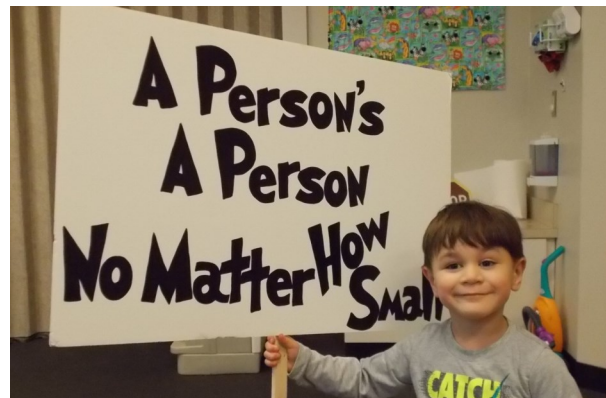
