RESOLUTION TO SUPPORT CHILDREN AND KINDERGARTEN READINESS

WHEREAS, United Way of Cowlitz & Wahkiakum Counties is committed to improving the lives of local community members and building strength in our community;

WHEREAS, we are committed to supporting children and families, and recognize that experiences in a child's early years have a profound impact on the rest of their lives;

WHEREAS, by investing in children, we as a community can help provide children with a strong start that helps them succeed in Kindergarten and beyond;

WHEREAS, studies have shown that early childhood education makes an impact in a child's long-term education¹;

WHEREAS, Kindergarten readiness is one indicator that helps us understand whether we as a community are investing in and supporting children and families;

WHEREAS, many children in Cowlitz and Wahkiakum Counties enter Kindergarten without the social, emotional and academic skills they need to be successful;

WHEREAS, in many parts of our community, the percentage of children ready for Kindergarten is well below the state average. In fact, in some parts of our community over 75% of children enter Kindergarten without the social, emotional and academic skills they need to succeed²;

WHEREAS, every child in our community deserves a strong start in life and access to a high quality education;

WHEREAS, we recognize that there are many barriers to preparing children for Kindergarten and that systemic challenges have disproportionately impacted low-income communities, communities of Black, Indigenous and people of color, English-language learners and children with disabilities.

WHEREAS, we are committed to leading with an equity lens and to removing the barriers that impact children. We are committed to empowering and strengthening systems that support families and that allow children to reach their full potential;
